

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

7 November 2016

Student of the week

Week 4 was very busy with students involved in Swim Scheme, a chess tournament and Year 6 students participating in transition events linked with Wadalba Community School. On all accounts our students displayed exemplary behaviour and were a credit to our school, themselves and their family.

Last Friday we had our first Kinder Orientation session. It was great to meet our 2017 Kinders and many of their parents. This session was well attended and I hope both parents and their children enjoyed this experience. It is important for both parents and children to attend all four sessions. The next dates for transition are as follows:

- Friday 11th November 9:15am - 11:00am (Parent Morning Tea)

- Friday 18th November 9:15am - 11:00am (Parent Workshop)

- Friday 25th November 9:15am - 11:00am (Teddy Bear's Picnic)

Thank you to Sam, Lily and Julian who hosted the parent information session and all of the guest speakers. Also thank you to the teachers, teacher's aides and Year 5 students who assisted in the Kinder classes. A big thank you to Mrs Shaw who has coordinated a quality transition program that will be of great benefit to both parents and their children.

School Improvements

At present there are a number of initiatives underway that will benefit students and make cosmetic improvements to the school. Some of these include:

- Student toilet block: During the Christmas holiday period the student toilet block will undergo a full revamp. This will include replacing old toilets, taps and basin. It will also include a fresh lick of paint and skylights. This will modernise this facility and ensure it is a bright, inviting place which is a far stretch from what it is at present.
- Improving our network: This will be done in stages to increase the speed of our network and allow for greater expansion in the future.
- Reopening the tree top walk: This will take some time as the structural integrity of this structure needs to be assessed and some of the trees will need some attention to remove dead or dangerous limbs. Thanks to the SRC movie day which will ensure this project will go ahead.

- Furnishing: We are in the process of purchasing modern furniture for classrooms and the Library. This includes soft furnishings such as beanbags and modern furniture such as stools and collaborative work stations. This will ensure we move with the times and the concept of future focussed learning.
- Relocation of the Sport Shed Storage Container: This will be moved near the netball / basketball court.
- Garden Club Our gardens are looking a bit tired at the moment. Our General Assistant, Martyn, does an amazing job around our school but unfortunately we only get his services 2 days a week. This means that he has limited time to spend in our gardens. In response to this we are going to start a Garden Club where students (green thumbs), under the direct supervision of staff, will be able to get their hands dirty in our gardens including the vegie patch. This idea is very much in its infancy but will be well underway next year. If you would be interested in assisting please contact the school.

Working Bee

Also I would be interested in organising a working bee during the Christmas break for any interested parents that would like to help with the beautification of our wonderful school. If you would be interested please complete the expression of interest form located in this newsletter. This will give me an indication of whether such an initiative will be possible.

Mobile Phones

Over the last few weeks we have had a small number of students bringing mobile phones to school. Whilst this has not been an issue I think it is timely that we revisit our school mobile phone policy so everyone is aware of their responsibility and the school expectations. The aim of this policy is for all members of the school community to be aware of their responsibilities in using mobile phones and other technology while on school premises.

Last week I discussed the policy with our Stage 3 students. Whilst I will not go into the policy in its entirety if you wish to discuss it I am more than happy to do so.

As a school we have a duty of care to our students and need to ensure these devices are not used inappropriately. Inappropriate use includes students using them to bully, intimidate or otherwise harass other people through any SMS or text message, photographic, video or other data transfer system available on the phone.

Students are entitled to bring a mobile phone to school but should consider / abide by the following:

- Mobile phones should only be brought to school in urgent and unusual circumstances. They are brought to school at the student's risk. The school will not accept responsibility for mobile phones lost, damaged, stolen or misused while at school and staff will not take responsibility for minding mobile phones during sport or other activities.
- Mobile phones must be turned off on entering the school gate and until students leave at the end of the day. They are to be handed in at the front office upon arrival to school and collected upon departure.
- ALL school business must be done through the school office eg students needing to go home sick.
- Students who breach these guidelines will be subject to the school's usual disciplinary code as described in the Tuggerawong Public School Behaviour and Welfare Policy.

- Students with urgent communication needs are welcome to access the phone in the front office following consultation with the Principal or nominee.
