Newsletter

Starting Week 5, upon my return from paternity leave, the newsletter will once again be published weekly. The newsletter is such an important communication tool and I feel that a fortnightly newsletter does not do this communication appropriate justice. The P&C are in favour with the newsletter to return to a weekly format.

Attendance

Attendance is regularly monitored at school, with the firm belief that missed school equals missed learning. Parents are reminded that absences must be notified to the school either with a phone call, on the school App or with a note to the teacher. This should be done the day your child is away or upon their return to school. Remember, if your child misses one day a week that will equal a term each year, which in turn, is approximately 1.5 years by the end of Year 6 and 2.75 years by the end of Year 12. SO: it is not okay to be away unless it is totally unavoidable.

If your child is absent from school, you are legally required to explain the reason for their absence within 7 days of the absence. If your doctor provides you with a medical certificate for your child, a copy can be provided to the school to support their absence if you choose. From time to time, families plan holidays during the school term. Family holidays are no longer an accepted category for exemption from school attendance. In most cases these will be documented as an unjustified leave. In the coming newsletters I will continue to illustrate the importance of regular attendance and offer some strategies for parents who are having difficulty getting their child / children to school. If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to make contact with myself or the school counsellor.

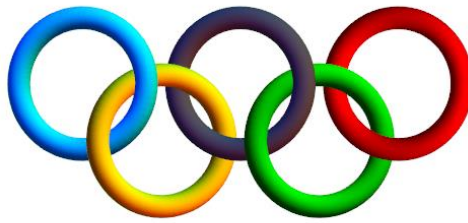

Minutes P&C Meeting 25th July 2016

Half yearly update: The P&C received a \$30,000 grant from _____ to assist the with financing the undercover walkways, which were installed in January this year. The P&C's focus this year is either an electronic sign board or upgrade to the playground. Targeted areas are learning to read for infants, targeted early numeracy program, gifted and talented program, Norta Norta for our Aboriginal children, PBL Positive behavioural learning and ongoing Local management business reform. Several upgrades to the school's appearance have been completed. In May Mr Dalkeith was successful in winning the Principals job at Brooke Ave Public school, and Mr Ireland continued here as relieving Principal. The Gov't's GONSKI funding allocated the school \$20,000 to teacher training. And the new online payment system went live.

Treasury The P&C's Westpac account started the year with \$14,000 and currently have \$12, 500. The Oosh's Bendigo account started with \$15,00 and currently has \$23,000. The canteen and uniform shop are both running at a profit. **Oosh** is running very successfully, with increased numbers from last year and therefore resulting in staff having to increase hours. QIP reports and Dept Spot checks have been positive with high praise and no major issues. **Canteen** is running solely through the flexi online system for lunch orders. They've held several fun and exciting promotions for St Pat's day, and State of Origin. They purchased a new slushie machine. **Uniforms** got an EFT machine which is working well and is a great asset to the school. We are aiming at putting Uniform also on Flexi perhaps later this year. **General business**, the school is strongly advocating the support of the Tuggerawong Pathway Project which is currently before the local parliament member for consideration. There are some local residents who are partitioning against it for ruining a beauty spot.

Presidents report: Welcome to our new Principal, we are looking forward to working together to continue to provide and improve our school.

Principals report: Appreciate the welcoming from the students, staff and parents. I am looking forward to holding a Question and Answer session for parents. Please fill in the preferred day/ time note so that I can confirm most appropriate time. Education week (commences week 3) with an assembly on Thursday 4th August with an assembly and open classrooms for parents to attend with their children. This term the boys/ girls toilets will be upgraded through assets management. Christmas carols will be held on Wed 7th Dec. I am looking at dollar for dollar initiative to relocate sports shed. Newsletter will be going out weekly. Teacher training funding going towards teaching PBL policy to teachers.

PBL policy new reward system to be launched at the start next year. Big signs will start to be displayed around the school this term. The teachers will start infiltrating the language into classrooms later this year to start getting kids ready for the new Positive behaviour for Learning policy.

Treasurers Report: Income and Expenditure statement Jan-June, canteen sales have increased \$3600 compared to same period last year, current surplus is \$91. Uniform is slightly down about \$1500 compared to same time last year, surplus of \$1584. Oosh is showing surplus of \$9735, which is \$9000 decrease from same time last year, which is a direct result in the rise of wages, the fees increase which came into affect on 1st July should rectify this. Fundraising is currently showing net surplus of \$3139. Westpac has \$12,500 and Bendigo has \$26,000.

Oosh report: Vacation care was very successful with the behaviour of the students was exceptional. The Oosh have some stick insects that they are now selling to families for \$10 each.
