

#### **Student Academic Reports**

On Tuesday, 3 July all students in K-6 will receive their Semester 1 report. Teachers spend many hours preparing your child/ren's report and work hard to ensure that it is a true and accurate reflection of your child's progress in their learning over the semester. Please take the time to discuss the report with your child and reflect on their achievements and where there needs to be a greater focus for improvements to occur. I encourage all parents to read the front cover of your child's report as this gives an overview of the effort and achievement scale that are used in the report.

Student attendance, both partial and whole day, are included. The attendance cut-off date for this semester is today. The reason for this is reports need to be printed off and signed by teachers and myself. This process takes a number of days.

You will notice a change to the reports this year. The tick the box section has changed to align with PBL. This section will still include the achievement levels eg Consistently, Usually and Needs Improvement. The new descriptors are as follows:

#### Respectful

- Takes pride in all they do
- Considers others
- Is patient and tolerant

Follows teacher instruction

#### Responsible

- Contributes to a positive classroom environment
- Makes positive choices and accepts accountability for actions
- Is organised, punctual and ready to learn
- Works well with others

#### **Personal Best**

- Is confident to ask questions and share ideas and opinions
- Challenges themselves and displays effort
- Displays a positive attitude and resilience
- Takes care to produce quality work

#### **Parent Reading Program**

Next term we will be trialling a Parent Assisted Immersive Reading (PAIR) program for our Kindergarten students and their families.

The PAIR program is built on the core premise that parents who regularly read aloud to their young child can dramatically improve the child's literacy skills and compliment what is happening in classrooms. This program provides parents with a scaffold to assist them in developing new skills to improve their child's reading. The research suggests this program:

- Encourages deep engagement with books
- Stimulates vocabulary growth
- Contributes to reading comprehension
- Promotes emergent literacy and language development; and
- Assists with building positive school / family relationships.

This program runs for a term. Each week all Kindergarten students take home the same book. Parents read this book over a number of nights following the prompts and questions as outlined in the text. The teacher also undertakes follow up activities to compliment the work being undertaken at home.

Before its implementation in Term 3 we will be having an information session on **Tuesday**, **3 July at 2:15pm** to further explain and introduce this worthwhile reading program. This program will complement our existing Home Reading program and can be included on their Home Reading card. Further information will follow in the coming weeks.

#### Life Skills Program

It was fantastic to see so many parents support our Life Skills Program. In total there were 75 parents who attended. Miss Gabby (instructor) said she has not seen so many parents attend before, particularly for the size of our school. Thank you parents for supporting this initiative. I hope you and your family can take something away from it.

#### **Pavers**

The name pavers that we had to move from near the canteen due to the instalment of the covered walkways (happening soon) need a new home within our school. If anyone knows of a local company that would be willing to undertake this work, please give me a call via the school. We are looking to have these take pride of place near our administration / office building.
