

Late Arrivals (Partial Absences)

We are noticing a number of students are arriving to school after the 9:00am bell each day. Setting a morning routine that is consistent can assist with students getting to school on time. Other strategies such as organising uniforms and

lunches the night before can also assist with this. The morning session is prime learning time with a focus on Literacy and/or Numeracy. Students arriving late miss key ideas and concepts and it can disrupt others learning as the teacher may have to stop the lesson or this can be a distraction for students. If you miss 10 to 20 minutes a day that can equal to over an hour of learning a week. Over a year this could equal to over 40 hours. If you need assistance / advice on getting your child to school on time don't hesitate to contact the school. Please endeavour to have your child / children at school on time every day!

Welcome to Week 8!

In literacy we continue to study a variety of texts. Students have enjoyed discussing the persuasive devices used in printed commercials. We have some excellent critical thinkers in our classroom, who can analyse and justify the use of devices such as symbolism. Continuing to develop these skills is so important in an age where kids (and adults!) are continually bombarded with visuals. Awesome work! In maths we have started our unit on addition and subtraction. The focus is on developing mental computation skills using strategies such as the jump, split and compensation strategies. The students have been surprised when I announce "I don't care about the answer!" Students often get so caught up with getting the answer correct they revert to inefficient strategies, such as counting on by ones. I encourage them to choose an efficient strategy and show me their working out. It's always great to see students working through this process.

Every time a new fortnight rolls around and I get to do the wrap up of all the learning and fun things that have taken

place in 5/6K, I am constantly astounded by how much we fit in and how much everyone is growing and improving!

In writing we have been focussing on how we can create interest to hook our readers and make them want to read more. Our aim is to grab a reader's attention in the first 2 – 3 sentences of our stories. Our first focus has been onomatopoeia (an idea easier to learn then it is to spell). 5/6K writers have shown enthusiasm and flair as they start their stories with a BANG! A POP! A BOOM! And A SPLASH!

We watched BTN and learnt a lot about the conflict in Kashmir, what living in Antarctica is like, had a great conversation about what single use plastic is doing to the environment and discussed why there is a need to consider alternate forms of packaging. It was clear from the student predictions of news items that may be covered in this week's episode, that 5/6K students are already taking notice of world and local current events that are being reported through the week. I am amazed in the student's interest levels on big picture stories and how insightful our students are at such a young age.

We solved the clues to uncover the mystery words 'spectacular' and' fragrant'. Can you work out the upcoming words from just their first clues?

TECHNOLOGY



This week we are focusing on the coding apps Bee-Bot and Tynker: Coding Games for Kids.

FREE - Bee-Bot

Bee-Bot is a free app that helps children learn about simple directional programming. Children use directional arrows to move the bee left, right, up or down through a range of settings. The app gets increasingly difficult as children progress through each level.



PAID - Tynker: Coding Games for Kids (free with inapp purchases)

This visual-based app teaches children to develop their own codes, complete coding courses and develop coding drones. It can connect with toys like Sphero, Lego WeDo2.0, and even the Philips Hue and Lux lighting systems. With



paid subscriptions, children have access to over 350 puzzle levels, a private Minecraft server, 18 online courses, and over 100 guided tutorials.
