Amazing K/1A have had another fabulous start to the Term. Everyone has settled in beautifully to our classroom routines and is consistently striving to display our school values; "Respectful, Responsible and Personal Best".

In Computers, all students are practising logging on independently and exploring using Microsoft Word. They have also been using Targeting Maths and Studyladder to support their learning in the classroom.



All of K/1A did their personal best at our K-2 cross country carnival. Everyone put in 100% effort and finished their races with big smiles on their faces. I was really impressed with the encouragement and support that all students had for their classmates. Everyone should be extremely proud of themselves.

In Mathematics, students have been focusing on addition and subtraction. Students were introduced to a new, whole class, dice game called "King of the Circle" which they have loved playing. They have also been using positional language to describe the location of objects. Kindergarten have been participating in number talks and Year 1 have started maths mentals where they answer a series of maths questions as quickly and accurately as possible.



Our class LOVES listening to stories! We have been reading lots of fun and interesting books in class. In the last few weeks we have read Olga the Brolga and Feathers for Phoebe by Rod Clement. Students then wrote about the book and created an artwork based on the main character. You can take a look at their awesome work in the school office foyer.



Our class is doing an amazing job at home reading with many students in the class receiving at least one home reading certificate this year. Well done K/1A!

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Ethics classes at Tuggerawong Public School

Dear Parents/ Carers and Grandparents,

Could you be an Ethics Teacher for Tuggerawong Public School?

We currently seeking a minimum of two new Teachers to teach Ethics from K to Year 6. Classes are limited to 22 students, and we have enough students to run two classes per session. We are desperately seeking volunteers so that classes can continue, and students do not miss out on this valuable opportunity.

Becoming an Ethics teacher is easy. Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of an online induction, and then training from comfort of own home. All lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available on a Tuesday from 9:00am -10:00am each week.



In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

-imagining how others feel-how do we treat living things?-what is laziness?-how do we disagree in a respectful way?-fairness
